1. Introduction

In recent period, the interest in local Member Associations (MAs) in developing their local Associations.

Under the leadership of the Papua New Guinea Football Association General Secretary, Mr. Gordon Manub and the PNGFA Technical Team, heralded the beginning of a new phase in the technical progress and development of football in the country. Prior to Mr. Manub's appointment, a technical programme existed but was fragmented and in need of an overhaul. At present the Papua New Guinea Football Association Technical Department has submitted applications and is currently in the process of implementation that will provide a structured framework from grassroots level through to advanced senior level of ability.

The PNGFA Technical Team has identified a raft of key challenges the department faces in furthering the development of the game in the country. Some of these challenges include developing;

- Education Programmes to provide high quality training and education to coaches, instructors, referees, medical support personnel and administrators throughout the country;
- Developing programmes to foster community football and participation at clubs and schools; attracting men and women into coaching and refereeing.

Papua New Guinea Football Association (PNGFA) now has a membership status in the OFC coaching convention.



The OFC coaching convention aims to:

- □ Enable MAs to improve the standard of football coaching in their country.
- □ Ensure competent coaches across all levels of the game, with specific education that relates to the players that they are supporting.
- □ Develop and implement sustainable coach development programmes, supported by a skilled coach educator workforce.
- □ Support the development of sustainable and regulated licencing systems.
- □ Engage and retain more coaches in the game.
- □ Promote and share good practice across the region.

- Project is approximately 90% Complete.
- Project is targeted to be completed by end of the year 2023.
- Partial end over of GS, Competitions, Technical Managers and Finance Offices already been made in November 2023 so these officers are starting to move offices.
- These Project is very significant to PNGFA as it provides very efficient office spaces, VIP Lounge Rooms for Corporate Companies to hire out yearly and etc...
- Re-arrangement of office spaces to cater for all the PNGFA Departmental Functions is very important as they dictates the delivery of programs, activities, etc...year in year out so with the maintenance of this office, things are looking very promising for PNGFA as a whole to progress at a more higher level in terms of Football Administrators working in good offices to deliver their programs, etc....

2. Kimbe Education Centre Maintenance/Construction Works Cont..

- Project Management Consultant is PNG Pride Holdings Ltd.
- Project has 3 major separate scopes namely; General Building Maintenance, Fencing Works & Field of Play (FOP) Upgrade Works.
- After successful closed tender process, following contractors successfully won the projects;
 - i. Plumbline Construction for Fencing Works
 - ii. Simpika Limited for Building Maintenance Works
 - iii. FOP Upgrade Works to be constructed by PNGFA Turf Maintenance Team
- Project is currently stalled.
- This project, if constructed were supposed to be another PNGFA Education Centre being based out from NGI Region and can benefit all the provinces across that part of the region.
- Further clearance will be sort from PNGFA Counsel so this project's construction contracts can be terminated for now.

3. Lae Education Centre Maintenance/Construction Works.

- Project Management Consultant is Eastral Ltd. However, due to long delay of the projects procurement process, they left.
- A submission is made to Exco through the Office of the General Secretary to get their approval if we can use Kimbe Project Managers instead of going out to tender again to re-appoint a new Project Manager.
- Project has 2 major separate scopes namely; i. General Building Maintenance Works, & ii. Electrical Reticulation Works,
- A Closed re-tendering had gone out and couple of reputable bidders are showing interest and are actually in the bidding process.

3. Lae Education Centre Maintenance/Construction Works.

- This Major Project is again basically the maintenance and Upkeeping of the entire existing facilities.
- We have almost a lot of structures at the Education Centre giving way already due to prolonged maintenance issues.
- These facilities, once maintained, will provide another very supportive environment where all our scheduled Technical and Competition's activities shall be accommodated and performed/run there.
- This maintenance works are not a waste of time, etc....but is very important towards assisting PNGFA as a whole in achieving its sanctioned programs and schedules, etc....

- Once PNGFA President/General Secretary and The Esco Members confirms a land, Highlands Project can begin planning and further documentation Works.



NATIONAL YOUTH SOCCER LEAGUE 2023

For the first time the first edition of this event was held in Lae and Port Moresby. The inaugural youth competition kicks off on the 18th of June 2023 with six teams featured in Southern Conference and seven teams featured in Northern Conference.

The U-19 competition was focused on the development aspects with an emphasis on exposing young talents and building the next generation of players. The aim was also to positively impact the players, coaches and referees and enhance their performance on and off the field, to provide experience, inspire learning and to improve performance at the national level.

The teams were divided into two conferences of Southern and Northern with the top two finishers in the two-conference progressing to the semifinals. The two winners of the semi finals progressing to the grand final, and the two losers to the third-place playoff. Central Amoana FC and Kempa FC top Southern Conference while in the Northern Conference saw Northern Teens FC finishing first and PS United FC settle for the second spot.

In the first semi-final in Port Moresby saw Central Amoana FC defeated Kempa FC 4-1, while in the second semi-final in Lae saw Northern Teens FC beat PS United FC 6-2. The win of Central Amoana FC and Northern Teens FC saw them through to the grand final while Kempa FC and PS United settle for the third-place playoff.

Kempa FC claimed the third place after beating PS United FC 5-4, while Northern Teens FC crowned the inaugural National Youth Soccer League champion after defeating Central Amoana FC 2-1.

CONFERENCE STAGE

For the second year the annual women's competition again registered 24 clubs kicks off on the 1st of July 2023. The Conference Stage of the WCSL was held in four different locations, Bougainville, Port Moresby, Lae and Mt Hagen.

SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

Held in Port Moresby at PNG Football Stadium and featured six clubs which includes defending champion Hekari United FC. With ten wins and topping the Southern Conference, Hekari United FC were joined by Port Moresby Strikers FC as runners-up in the quarter-finals.

NORTHERN CONFERENCE

Hosted at the PNGFA Education Centre in Lae, this conference featured 2022 WCSL runners-up Bara FC along with Rainy Lae FC, Sepik FC from East Sepik province, FC Morobe Wawens and Lae City Dwellers FC. FC Morobe Wawens secured their place in the quarterfinals following 6 victories, a draw and a loss. They were joined by Lae City Dwellers FC.

NGI EASTERN CONFERENCE

The NGI Eastern Conference was held in the Autonomous Region of Bougainville at the Hutjena Oval where the winner of last year, Kiara FC were joined by Hamatana FC, Buka Atolls FC, North Bougainville FC, South Bougainville FC and Central Bougainville FC. North Bougainville topped the conference with relative ease scoring 36 goals from 9 wins and one loss. Also qualifying for the quarter-finals was Kiara FC.

HIGHLANDS CONFERENCE

Hosted at Kimininga Police Barracks Oval in Mt Hagen, Highlands Conference featured last years winner Mommers FC, Kagua Erave FC, Simbu FC, Mt Hagen FC, Kuri FC, Blue Kumuls FC and SHP FC of Mendi in Southern Highlands province. The undisputed queens of the Highlands Conference Mommers FC top the conference with 33 points, Blue Kumuls FC joined them in the quarter-finals after securing the second spot.

QUARTER FINALS

The quarter-finals of the competition were one-off matches held over the weekend of 30 September in four different locations. At PNG Football Stadium saw Hekari United belted Port Moresby Strikers FC 8-0. At Hutjena Oval in Buka, North Bougainville FC saw off Kiara FC 8-3 in a penalty shoot-out. In Mt Hagen, Mommers FC proved too strong for Blue Kumuls FC with a 3-0 victory and over in Lae, Lae City Dwellers FC forfeited FC Morobe Wawens for no-show with a score of 3-0 that earned them a spot in the semi-final.

SEMI FINALS

A draw decided the match-ups and Lae City Dwellers to host Mommers FC and Hekari United to host North Bougainville FC in the semi-finals play-off on 14 October. Lae City Dwellers come out 4-2 victorious over Mommers FC while Hekari United FC trashed North Bougainville FC 25-0. The win by Hekari United FC and Lae City Dwellers FC take both into the final.

FINALS

The winners were confirmed and the host venue for the final was in Port Moresby. The match kicked off with a good number of spectators eager to see which side to be crowned the WCSL 2023 champion. Hekari United FC proved too strong to beat Lae City Dwellers FC 4-0. The finals came after four months of competitive conference challenge in four regions.

The Champion Club of the Women's Competition will be representing Papua New Guinea in the OFC Women's Champions League next year.

From 31 May PNG Football Association confirms eight teams to participate in the first edition of the Premier Soccer League. The competition got underway on the 1 July 2023 in Port Moresby and Lae featuring three Port Moresby-based teams, three Lae-based teams, and a team each from Madang and Highlands.

A total of 126 matches were played for five months which saw Hekari United FC topping the points table with 37 points followed by Port Moresby Strikers FC on 29 points, Lae City Dwellers FC on 24 points, Lae City FC on 23 points, Gulf Komara FC on 19 points, FC Morobe Wawens on 14 points, United Highlands FC on 10 points and Madang FC on zero.

After wrapping up the two round-robin stage, Hekari United FC, Port Moresby Strikers FC, Lae City Dwellers FC and Lae City FC are in the top four and qualify for the semi-final play-off.

The semi-final and final were confirmed to be held in Port Moresby on the 09 December and 16 December 2023.

The minor premier and the runners-up of the competition after the round-robin stage will be representing PNG in the OFC Champions League 2024.

We are closer to archiving President Mr. Natto's vision of bringing in 9 Provinces to the Family of PNGFA that have been neglected for decades.

Summary

- Out of the 9 Provinces Proposed, 5 x Provinces have already completed their Election Process and are now Recognised as Associate Members of PNGFA and there are as follows; (Vanimo SA, Wewak SA, Alotau SA, Popondetta SA & East New Britain SA)
- New Island and Gulf Provinces have issues which is why they cannot be recognised as Associate Members as yet due to circumstances and difficulties faced, it is recommended to establish Gulf SA in Malalawa. There is also a need to revisit the New Ireland Soccer Association and establish contacts with people who have a passion for Football. Apparently, the committees in New Island have gone awal
- 2 Two provinces that are still pending PNGFA's are (1) Jiwaka Soccer Association & and (2) Hela Soccer Association. PNGFA will make a visit to these Provinces in 2024.
- Most of the full pledge Member Associations have run their competition despite hiccups whilst only 4 out of the 18 Member Associations failed to run their competition this year.

- Take stock of all Media and Communication Equipments including servicing them,







